Gustav Mahler was born in 1860, and died in 1911. Like Beethoven, Schubert, Bruckner, and Vaughan Williams, Mahler wrote nine symphonies. Mahler liked to use huge resources and his 8th symphony requires 1000 people to perform it. His Symphony No.5 is famous for this beautiful adagietto.
